





# Division Order (DO) Certificate Program MODULE 2: Land Title, Title Examination & Changes of Ownership

#### Course conducted in May and November.

NOTE: Membership in National Association of Division Order Analysts (NADOA) required for this course.

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Overview	Module 2 of the Division Order Certificate Program focuses on how and when legal title to oil and gas properties changes hands and the legal requirements to do so effectively. To that end, we begin with a lecture on Real Property Law, the foundation for all land work. In this lecture, we examine the different degrees and types of ownership in real property as well as the various instruments used to change ownership. Then, we look at how title is examined and "chained" by Landman when initially trying to ascertain ownership for leasing purposes.		
	In Week 2, we focus more on Changes of Ownership including which documents are required for each specific type of transaction. In Probate Law, we examine how property is transferred when an owner is deceased. Finally, the course concludes with the law of escheat, that is, when states require monies placed in suspense in our system to be held by the state, and its application in all the different oil and gas producing states.
